[CNE26] DBZ Stichtse Roundabout

This cache is located in the Bergkwartier district, which is divided into De Berg-Zuid and De Berg-Noord. The Stichtse Rotonde wooded area borders directly on the De Berg Zuid district, which is also the origin of the abbreviation DBZ in the cache title. If you want to visit all the DBZ and DBN caches in one walk, it's approximately 10 km. The mysterious Stichtse Rotonde itself is a very short walk.

The Stichtse Rotonde is a traffic circle in Amersfoort. The N221 and N237 highways connect to this circle. The Stichtse Rotonde was the western junction of the old A28 south of Amersfoort to the Hoewelaken interchange, which opened on December 17, 1962. In 1986, the junction with the A28 was replaced by the current A28.

The interchange consists of a roundabout, where the N237 from Soesterberg, the former A28 (now N221)

towards Hoevelaken, and the Utrechtseweg in Amersfoort connect, and an outer ring road, where the N221 from Soest connects. The entire interchange, including all connections, covers an area of almost 15 hectares. In addition to the extensive asphalt, a significant portion of this area consists of (fragmented) greenery, separated by roads. "

It

takes two to tango" is a 1989 artwork located on the Stichtse Rotonde on the south side of Amersfoort. It is a work by Ernst Hazenbroek. The artwork is 16 meters high and weighs 20 tons, and is located on a prominent access road for visitors to Amersfoort. From different angles, this work looks different.




