Mining Road 17, from industry to beer

Along Mijnbouwweg in Amersfoort lies a street that lives up to its name. No mine shafts or ore trains, but a past where **work, manufacturing, and production** were central. This area grew into a modest industrial zone in the twentieth century, with workshops and warehouses that helped build the city.

Industrial past:

In the years following World War II, Amersfoort grew rapidly. Workshops, warehouses, and small factories

sprang up around railway lines and connecting roads. Mijnbouwweg was part of this industrial network. No large factory with plumes of smoke, but rather a collection of modest buildings where craftsmanship and industry set the tone. Number 17 stands as a silent witness to this: a building that saw generations come and go, while techniques, materials, and operations changed.

Industrial heritage site

Mijnbouwweg 17 is a relic of that era. The building dates back to the mid-20th century and still exudes the atmosphere of industrial Amersfoort: robust construction, functional form, and a clear focus on labor. Machines and materials were used here, in an era when craftsmanship and industry went hand in hand.

Industrial heritage with a new flavor.

Today, the building has taken on a new function as **a brewery**. Where once the sound of machinery, now brewing takes place. The brewery fits surprisingly well with the spirit of the place. After all, brewing beer is also a form of industry—albeit small-scale and artisanal. What makes this building special is that the **craft never truly disappeared**. Where once machines rattled and manual labor was central, today work is once again carried out with care and precision. Malt, hops, and water have replaced steel and oil, but the core remains the same: craftsmanship. Thus, the industrial character of this place lives on, with a modern and tasteful interpretation.

For the cacher:

This cache is located in a place where past and present collide. Take a moment to explore the building and imagine how work was once done here—and how that tradition of crafting continues today.




